


the certification stage of this program and have seen many benefits from the teacher professional learning right through to the students engaging and having fun with PDHPE curriculum.

Mrs Best and her merry helpers will be operating the canteen right up until the last day of school 2018. WOW, we are so lucky to have a canteen open every





Small Screen Time

With the holidays fast approaching and with the increase number of students from as young as Year 1 spending time playing the current trending internet based game – Fortnite. It is timely reminder of the recommendations for children for small screen time (SST).

For children watching TV, surfing the web and playing computer games or small handheld devices can be good fun – and even educational! But spending too much time sitting still each day can be bad for your health. It's important to balance screen time with active play time so your body can grow strong, fit and healthy.

Effects of too much screen time on children

- Neck and back posture.
- Eyesight health.
- Straining of wrist, thumb and elbow.
- Sleep deprivation occurs.
- · Weight gain or fluctuation.
- · Communication skills decrease
- Social skills suffer including increase of aggression
- Exposure to explicit or inappropriate material/behaviour



Help for parents

- There are organisations that help review content suitability for children (<u>www.commonsensemedia.org</u>)
- Use parental controls to block/filter Internet and television content. You can also set devices to the "do not disturb" mode to help limit screen use (eg: the family link app for android devices).
- The brightness and blue light from screens can be changed to a dimmer and 'warmer' setting.

Screen time should be supervised and monitored by parents. Find ways to be involved with your child's screen time so that your supervision becomes another way of spending time with your child.

Remember:

- 8-12 hours of sleep and 1 hour of "huff and puff" exercise should always take priority over screen time.
- Be vigilant checking ratings and make decisions accordingly (ie Fortnite is rated M 12+)
- Be aware of games that allow multiplayer and online chat and apply settings as necessary
- Gather information on online games and social media forums and how they can become a platform gateway for inappropriate grooming through online communication
- Set screen time guidelines for your family and involve older children in the decision making.
- Monitor the use of screens, keeping in mind the recommended maximum per day is 2 hours.
- Consider turning off the TV and other devices during meals.
- Keep TVs and screens out of bedrooms and in high traffic areas.
- Be a role model for your kids, by being active and limiting your own use of screens.


