

From the Principal

Welcome to Week 1

Welcome back to school and term 4, how the year is flying by, next thing you know it will be Christmas.

KSPS school site had an intensive and busy holiday break with many different building projects being




conducted during this time. Completed to date is the removal of old pavers and concrete in the walkway leading to the canteen and replaced with all concrete. Alongside this is a giant new garden bed, which in-time will house bush tucker plants, native species and various aboriginal artefacts and totems. Currently we have moved



the 'Keys to Success' into this space for the interim period. We also have painting in KR and KOR, OOSH, the old hall, external D block, E block. Carpet has been replaced in the old hall, KOR and OOSH. Added to this has been vinyl in the some of the walkways to prevent carpet wear and tear. To come will be 50 new black fence panels, painting inside the canteen area where the sports equipment is and internal senior toilets. The handrailing external to the top of A block is being replaced as well. So many exciting construction items across our school will contribute to the ongoing refurbishment of KSPS. Very soon our stage 2 and 3 students will be attending our annual school camps. Stage 2 will visit Mowbray Farm at Picton for 2 nights (3 days) and stage 3 will visit Bathurst/Jenolan Caves/Katoomba for 3 nights (4 days). This is super exciting and preparations are in full swing. We encourage parents to be positive and resilient when talking through camp with your child, always letting them know that the staff are there to help them overcome any concerns or worries. Camps are for building resilience, exploring new places outside our regular environment, building friendships and tackling challenges head-on with support and encouragement. All students not attending camp are expected to be at school each day. Stage 2 and 3 parents are reminded to see your child's class teacher sooner rather than later if you have any questions, do not leave things until the last minute.

A reminder that the P&C will be running a Trivia night later this term on Saturday the 9th of November. This is an exciting evening for parents to come along have some fun whilst raising money for our school. The theme is "At the Movies". See further on in the newsletter for details and the link for ticket purchasing. Tickets are \$20 per head or \$160 for a table of 8. Any donations of prizes for the night are kindly accepted through the front office.



As the weather warms up a reminder all students need to have a hat to play. There are many lost hats in the Lost Property area in the canteen, please check. Also, students need a water bottle so that they can stay hydrated. Yesterday students were given their Swap It program goodie bags with material to help parents with packing healthy items in lunchboxes. There was also a drink bottle and freezer cube for keeping lunches fresh in the warmer weather. The Swap It program works alongside our Healthy Canteens Guidelines which has now been approved as we are meeting the guidelines. Congratulations to our P&C and Mrs Best in the canteen for meeting all the requirements of the healthy canteen's guidelines.



Safety is always our main priority at KSPS. Included in this is the safe driving practices in and around our school. No cars are permitted into the rear of the school on the access driveway when there are students on the oval. Driving into the rear of the school for OOSH pickups in the afternoon are also prohibited. Designated school zones have stringent parking and speed limits, a reminder that both police and NCC parking rangers do attend school during drop off and pick up times. All school users have the right to be safe in and around our school, so let's all do our part.

Our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the DoE Initiative *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers of all KSPS students' questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is open to all KSPS parents/carers and is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. **The parent survey will be conducted between 16 September and 25 October**. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.


School News

COUNSELLOR CORNER

Preparing for school camp

It's normal for some kids to feel anxious about going to camp. Here's how to help them enjoy the adventure with confidence.

At a glance:

Some anxiety about going away to camp is normal.

School camp gives kids the opportunity to experience independence and make new friends.

Talk positively to your child about your own experiences at camp.

Find out if your child can choose a friend as a room mate.

Make sure your child can master skills like applying sunscreen and doing their own hair.

Have your child help label and pack all the belongings they are taking to camp.

School camp is one of the highlights of childhood – chances are you can still remember some of the campfire songs, the smell of damper cooking and the names of the kids you bunked with. However, it's also true that for some children (and their parents) the thought of staying away overnight can create a little anxiety.

It's not uncommon for kids to worry about:

- who they'll room with
- 'being left out' of things
- whether something might go wrong
- feeling homesick
- other understandable concerns.

Even the most outgoing and confident child may have a few moments of separation anxiety as the time to leave gets closer.

Children enjoy the challenges that camps provide – sharing a room, embracing challenging activities, sharing responsibility for things like washing up and getting to know their teachers outside of the classroom.

It's worth remembering that every challenge your child overcomes contributes to their resilience and self-confidence when facing more unfamiliar situations later on.

Session 1: Where Did I Come From?

Time: 6:00pm

Audience: Year 3 and 4 students and their parents/carers

Sessions: 1 x 60-minute session

Program focus:

- Discuss the male and female reproductive systems, foetal development and the birth process
- · Personal safety and protective behaviours

Note: Older students are encouraged to attend if they have not previously seen this program.

Session 2: Preparing For Puberty Time: 7:15pm

Audience: Year 5 and 6 students and their parents/carers

Sessions: 1 x 60-minute session

Program focus:

- Discuss the physical changes of puberty, emphasising that it can be different for everyone
- Develop students' understanding of periods and sperm production, as well as the physical, emotional, social and intellectual changes associated with puberty for both boys and girls
- Enhance awareness of children's personal safety and protective behaviours

Note: Younger students are welcome to attend at the discretion of their parents/carers.

PACKING HEALTHIER LUNCHBOXES

Our school is committed to supporting all children to live healthy and happy lives. By encouraging children to eat healthy everyday foods at school, together we can make a big difference to a child's health and their ability to learn.

Why lunchboxes?



1/3

Of a child's dietary intake occurs at school.



GOOD NUTRITION

Improves behaviour and concentration in the classroom.



EVERYDAY FOODS

Give children energy to play, grow and learn.

Of primary school aged children eat enough vegies daily.

What does a healthy lunchbox look like?

A healthy lunchbox, full of everyday foods, includes:



Good for kids good for life Crunch&Sip®:

Vegetables or a piece of fruit.

Recess:

Vegetables or a piece of fruit + 1-2 everyday snacks.

Lunch:

Sandwich / wrap / roll with everyday fillings or alternative such as pasta or fried rice.

Drink:

Water and/or reduced fat plain milk.
